The web site's main service offers the possibility to record and save video clips with greetings for your near and dear, but administration of Internet accounts and password information is also provided.

'What happens to your life online when you die?' is a question that is becoming a big issue in the media. Mentomori.com provides an answer to this question. Mentomori.com offers a secure location for online user information and passwords with instructions on how accounts should be handled in the event of the user's death.

- 'It all started with an idea on saving a message for my kids if I ever had an accident, but I couldn't find a suitable service on the net. So I decided to build one myself', says Can Umarlar, original founder of Mentomori.com. Can continues 'Since we started working on this in 2008 the debate about social networks and how account information is handled after a person's death led to the idea to add this service as well.

Mentomori.com poses the question 'what do you want to say to your loved ones when you die' - a difficult question that hopefully starts a personal reflection on key elements of your life.

- 'In a society, where many live in a state of 'later', I'll deal with things 'later', we feel it is important to offer a service where a you get to reflect on what matters to you right now. We hope to be able to not only provide a practical service for handling account information, but also to change the way people relate to life and death in the western world, and to contribute in a small way to make the loss of a loved one easier', says Donnie SC Lygonis, co-founder and business developer.

In the event of the user's death the greetings will be sent to the registered recipients as well as instructions on i.e. closing the user's online accounts on the net. Should the user not wish to send instructions for account administration to relatives, Mentomori will provide this service. To secure the user's information, Mentomori.com co-operates with the Swedish security company specializing in Internet security, Secode. The service is a monthly subscription.
